First Officer Requirements

- Legal authorization to work in the United States
- Must be able to read, write, fluently speak and understand the English Language
- Must have an ATP or be qualified to obtain an ATP or Restricted ATP (CFR 61.159 and 61.160)
- Current FAA First Class Medical Certificate
- FCC Radio License
- Valid civilian passport and the authorization to travel to and from all cities and countries served by Air Wisconsin
- Valid United States driver's license
- Graduation from accredited four year college preferred

CTP (Crewmember Training Program)

An ATP (Airline Transport Pilot) certificate is the highest level of pilot certification issued by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) in the United States. It allows a pilot to act as the pilot-in-command of an aircraft for airline operations and is required for pilots who want to serve as captains or first officers for commercial airlines.

A CTP (Crewmember Training Program) certificate is part of the process to obtain an ATP certificate, specifically addressing the training requirements set forth in the FAA regulations. The CTP is designed to ensure pilots possess the necessary knowledge and skills for advanced multi-engine flight operations and is a prerequisite for taking the ATP written exam.

To qualify for the ATP certificate, a pilot must meet specific requirements regarding flight hours, undergo the CTP course, pass a written test, and demonstrate their flying skills through a practical

test (checkride).

Early Entry into Airline using CTP (Crewmember Training Program)
